The main focus for our Children's Services staff, who work directly with these children and youth, is to ensure they obtain an education. Our success rate is encouraging, as many of our youths now stay in school full time, successfully complete high school and go on to post-secondary education at college or university.

Board Commitment

Our Board of Directors believes that no young person in our care should be denied the training or education needed to assist them in becoming productive, independent adults. The number of CAS youths pursuing a post-secondary education has continued to increase each year. We were able to start providing grants in 2001, and to date have issued over 100 grants to youths to help them be successful in their post-secondary educational goals, and this has helped prepare them to become successful adults.

Many youths in care, supported by the Youth-In-Care Education Assistance Fund, have been able to successfully complete their post secondary studies and are working in a variety of fields throughout our community and our province. They have become nurses, early childhood educators, teachers, equipment operators, chefs, and social workers to name a few.
